## POSSIBLE FELLING OF TREES ALONG DONINGTON ROAD?

## Mark and Mary De Ath attended the Parish Council Residents Forum in July to raise the issue

Mr De Ath had overheard a conversation in the lane at the end of his driveway between Christopher Heneage and the ELDC tree officer, Richard Littlewood. The Council had requested ditch clearance to prevent flooding and Mr Heneage seemed to be suggesting that tree growth was the problem for the size of machine that they would like to use and proposed the removal of trees along the Donington Road up to the Caistor High Street. Twenty to twenty-five meters between remaining trees was mentioned. A firewood contractor was in attendance. Mr and Mrs De Ath thought that this suggested wholescale removal of trees and would be to the detriment of the natural environment for villagers. They thought that the work would be starting end of September/beginning of October.

### SLEDGE HAMMER TO CRACK A NUT?

Donington Road was part of a network of old Drovers Tracks in the area - signified by the large width between hedges. Reducing the trees along the whole length from the Caistor High Street to the triangle junction with Station Road appears an excessive response occasional flooding from the stream pipe under the road and ditches along "Long Field" near the entrance to the Permissive Path. Many of trees themselves on the top-end verges were planted by Lincolnshire County Council in the early 1980's! - along with those along the Hainton straight. At the time of writing residents/walkers with strong views are encouraged to make their voices heard.

Three Councillors were in attendance - Paul Elliot (Chair); Shirley Asquith; Marcus Edmundson. Apologies were received from: Paul Cutts; Debbie Challender.

Cllr Asquith had informed East Lindsey District Council of the vacancies for councillors and had advertised for interest to join the Council via a notice in the bus shelter. Cllr Elliott said that ex-Cllr Spencer had not given a reason for his resignation. Ex-Cllr Spencer had been vice-chair. Cllr Asquith was to check whether there was a requirement for council to have a vice-chair and this item was to be on the next agenda.

It was also agreed to pay the church clock donation.



### LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL NEWS

Grass cutting on highway verges is being reduced as the council works to balance the books. Under the new set-up, the council will now only fund two safety cuts a year alongside the road. This will save the authority around £750,000 annually. In some areas, the work will be taken on by the district/parish/ town council, who may also carry out additional cuts at their own discretion.

### **Lincoln Eastern Bypass**

Carillion Construction officially started in June on the Lincoln Eastern Bypass. The £99m scheme - due to be completed in winter 2019 - will include four new roundabouts, plus two main bridges and three pedestrian/ cyclist ones. Network Rail is also building a railway bridge next to Washingborough Road, allowing the road to run under the railway. Together with the North Hykeham Relief Road, which is still in its initial stages, the Lincoln Eastern Bypass will form a crucial part of a complete city ring road.



### EAST LINDSEY DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS

Works are continuing to upgrade 2,705 footway lights in East Lindsey to LED as part of an initiative set to save 530,300kw of energy and around £110,000 in operating costs per year.

East Lindsey District Council is investing £694,000 of capital funding for the upgrade to the lights that it is responsible for, making them 68% more energy efficient. The District Council is responsible for footway lights but Lincolnshire County Council is responsible for street lights. Among local villages upgraded so far are: East Barkwith,; Donington On Bain; Hainton.

### Bigger fines for irresponsible dog owners

The fine for failing to clear up after your dog in East Lindsey will increase from £75 to £100 on October 1, 2017, when a new Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) comes into force in the district. The PSPO, which will replace the existing Dog Control Order following a change in national legislation, also identifies areas of land that dogs will not be permitted on, including play parks and certain areas of the beach during the summer season.
